The First Trimester Campaign aims at identifying and enrolling clients into the program during the earliest stages of their pregnancy. There are a number of reasons why African American women do not seek prenatal care during the first trimester of their pregnancy. From studies conducted and from our experience with program participants, no one reason is the single most prevalent barrier. By focusing on early prenatal care at such community events as The College Fest, MCCN-BIH encourages the community to seek care as soon as a pregnancy is known.
